Fusing together his modern and classical background, Greek-born, London-based guitarist and composer Stelios Kyriakidis aims to create music for guitar that is as understated as it is stirring. Influenced by neoclassical, folk and film music elements, Stelios is equally at home in writing music as he is performing it on stage, seeking to deliver an organic and transcendent experience in his live shows.

Stelios has been interviewed and had his music featured on BBC Radio London. The Minor7th magazine described him as *“Kyriakidis has a delightful way of creating bright, shimmering melodies that you want to hear again”*. A Moment And A Thousand Years, one of the pieces in his latest Agalia album, entered the Apple Music Classical Charts in Estonia and Denmark. The same piece was filmed by Sofar Sounds, during a performance at the Old Church in London.

Another piece from the Agalia album, A Wonderful Life, has been described by the Music Dances When You Sleep blog as *“Soaked in its self-propelled moment of beauty the tune serenades that which we all know - life - through the finest pair of lenses one can ask for.”* The piece has reached over 140 thousand streams on Spotify. New Beginnings, the opening piece from the same album, was featured in the campaign video for a car-free London by the climate action charity Possible.

Stelios has performed in the USA, UK, Germany and Greece in places such as the 21st Century Guitar Conference (Indianapolis, USA), Green Note (London, UK), King's Place (London, UK) Handmade & Recycled Festival (Athens, Greece), Bavul Kunst und Kultur Cafe (Berlin, Germany) and Inspiring Futures (Sheffield, UK), among others. He composed the official music for the 2011 Athens Video Dance Project in Greece.

Having released three EPs to date, Stelios is currently working on his full length album and preparing for his upcoming performances in London.

Born in Drama, Greece, he started his musical journey by studying piano as a teenager. After a year of piano tuition, he became increasingly dissatisfied with the dry and uninspiring delivery of the lessons. This dissatisfaction, along with the discovery of rock and metal music, led him to learn electric guitar. He studied the instrument with renowned local teachers and players and it was during that time he discovered his passion for music.

At the age of 19, Stelios moved to London, UK to expand his horizons and pursue his musical dream. He became a member and songwriter of various bands, most notably the goth rock band 'The Faces of Sarah'. Some of his performances with The Faces of Sarah include The Underworld (London), Oravafest (Slovakia), Dada club (Greece), Budapest and various venues in the UK, from London to Newcastle. After 2 years of performing and touring with the band, Stelios felt the need to broaden his musical knowledge in order to evolve as a musician. At the age of 27, he decided to study classical guitar, music theory and composition.

Stelios studied classical guitar with Alberto Perez Fernandez, Kasia Elsner Weir, Graham Anthony Devine and with the teacher he considers his mentor, Carlos Bonell of the Royal College of Music. He also studied Harmony, Counterpoint and Orchestration with Paul Sarcich and Paul Bartholomew. His studies resulted in a Diploma from ABRSM (DipABRSM, classical guitar) and a Master of Music in classical guitar from the Trinity Laban conservatoire in London. During his studies at Trinity, he has received a financial award from the Stavros Niarchos Foundation.

Stelios has also composed music for short films, contemporary dance, documentaries and theatre. His compositions have been performed in places such as the Robin Howard Theatre (UK), East London Dance (UK), Vault Festival (UK) and Arion Academy Guitar Festival (Greece). He has worked as a composer with Middlesex University, Trinity Laban Conservatoire and the NHS. In 2015, he wrote and performed a score for 'Trivialis', a dance performance showcased at the Resolution! festival and gaining a residency at the Blue Elephant theatre. Philippa Newis (Thinking on my feet) wrote on her review: *"Stelios Kyriakidis's score is brooding and imposing. The electric guitar throbs and pulses, enveloping the performers in a dense cocoon of sound."*

Stelios also teaches classical/acoustic guitar and music theory and has over 14 years of experience delivering lessons face to face in London or online, worldwide.
